Dear Ms. Enniss:

This is a third partial response to your November 6, 2009, Freedom of Information Act request for all documents related to Class B random source dealers supplying live dogs and cats for research, teaching, and testing who have been or are currently under investigation for apparent violations of the federal Animal Welfare Act. This request includes investigation of problems identified during trace backs conducted on dealers' records pertaining to Mark and Penny Lynch, dba LBL Kennels (32-B-0045), et al. Your request was received in this office on November 9, 2009, and assigned case number FOIA 10-077. We apologize for the delay of this response.

Agency employees conducted a thorough search of their files and enclosed on a CD-ROM are 250 pages of responsive records. However, information has been withheld under FOIA Exemption 6, 5 U.S.C. § 552(b)(6). This exemption protects information from disclosure when its release would cause a clearly unwarranted invasion of personal privacy. This same information has been withheld under FOIA Exemption 7(C), 5 U.S.C. § 552(b)(7)(C). This exemption protects from disclosure records or information collected for law enforcement purposes when its release could reasonably be expected to constitute an unwarranted invasion of personal privacy. Specifically, we withheld third party names and personal identifiers such as addresses, phone numbers, social security numbers, and license plate numbers.

You may appeal our partial denial of this information, or you may hold your appeal in abeyance until your final response is received. If you choose to appeal, your appeal must be in writing and must be received within 45 days of the date of this letter. Send to:


